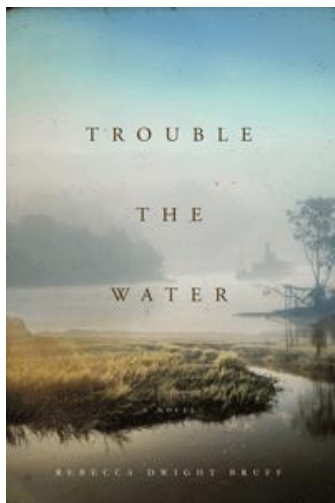

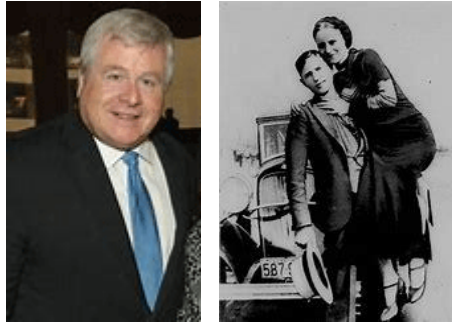
Encore hosts Game Day!
