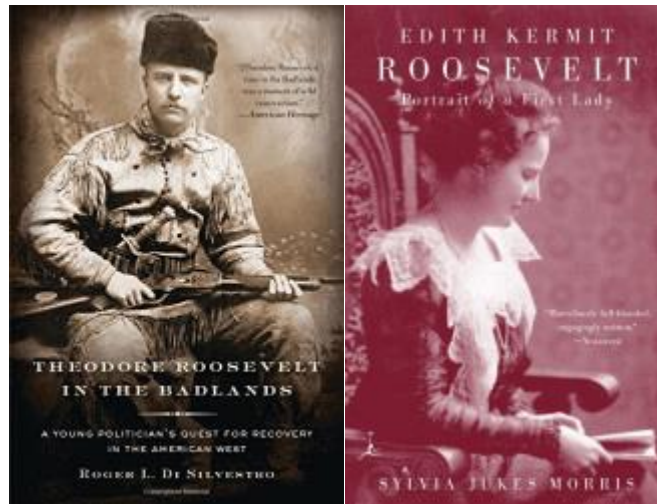
One Big Serve!
