The President's Message

Dear UMW Friends,

So, what were you doing when you were in your early twenties? I would guess that many of us were launching careers or marriages or families or some combination of the above. I think it is safe to assume that most of us were not launching a ministry on the other side of the globe as were our February guest speakers! I'll admit I was pretty self-absorbed at that age: I was barely aware of the poverty in the city where I lived, much less on another continent. So I find it inspiring (and pretty amazing) to hear about the successes of the Akola Project (www.akolaproject.org) and Arise Africa (www.ariseafrica.org) and young women like Brittany and Alissa who saw a problem and decided to tackle it.

Way back in 1869, eight Boston women saw a problem in India and decided to tackle that problem: the lack of edu-

women and children in Africa, sought to create ministries to meet those needs.

Akola helps create infrastructure in villages to support economic opportunity and job training programs for marginalized women in those villages. The ministry seeks out a means for Ugandan women to maintain a sustainable livelihood by which they can support themselves and their dependents. The handcrafted jewelry produced by the women of Akola is sold online, in Akola's Dallas storefront and through retailers around the country, including a partnership with Neiman Marcus.

Arise Africa seeks to help lift Africans out of poverty by focusing on health care, education and discipleship. The ministry operates two children's homes; serves meals to 4,000 children daily; runs a child-sponsorship program which finances the educational, medical and spiritual needs of over 300 children; and works in two community schools to help provide resources and qualified teachers.

cation and medical facilities to serve women in that country. They too were not daunted by the distance, the logistical challenges or the funds needed for such a venture. They formed an organization to send two female missionaries to India. The organization they formed was the predecessor to what is now UMW, the largest denominational faith organization for women, with over 800,000 members and ministries in 110 countries. So, it is fitting that our unit of UMW begins the year with the stories of contemporary women who also saw needs among underserved populations and created ministries to address those needs.

I hope to see you all in February as we begin the year exploring our 2017 theme: "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24).

2017 GEORGIA BATES AWARD HONOREE!



UMW is pleased to announce that Jan McClendon is the 2017 Georgia Bates Award recipient. The Georgia Bates Award, sponsored by HPUMC UMW, is an annual award honoring a woman who has made a significant and lasting contribution to missions. It is named after Georgia Bates, who was a nurse sponsored in mission by HPUMC for 35 years to care for the poor in West Dallas.

Jan McClendon has been a force for Meal on Wheels at HPUMC for over 30 years. On Christmas day in 1983, to emphasize the true spirit of Christmas, she took her family and delivered Meals on Wheels for the first time. Once she became a regular driver. Jan was asked to become the lay coordinator of the Meals on Wheels program at HPUMC. She had found her calling. With a talent for organization and logistics and a love of people, Jan was a natural fit for Meals on Wheels. Under Jan's guidance over the next 30 years, the number of routes delivered by HPUMC drivers has increased from one to seven, with around 200 current active volunteers including members of Munger Place Church. Literally hundreds of people have found a place of service driving the HPUMC routes since the program began in 1973. HPUMC has also provided significant financial support as well as serving as a role model for other religious groups involved in Meals on Wheels in Dallas.

Jan will receive her award at the April 3 UMW lunch program, so mark your calendars to be there to help HPUMC UMW honor her!
